

Global GDP and GDP for Norway's trading partners. 1) Annual change. Percent2)





Policy rates and estimated forward rates at 11 May



Labour costs in Norway relative to trading partners.¹⁾ Index²⁾





Change between 2014 and 2016. In billions of NOK. Constant 2014 prices



Constant 2014 prices.¹⁾ In billions of NOK





Volume. Annual change. 1) Percent





