



Norway has been increasingly affected by extreme weather events




Payouts from natural damages (Million USD, 2018)








Extreme weather events affect households' income, wealth and consumption











- Larger declines in wealth and consumption for homeowners vs renters



- · Larger declines in income when local firms severely damaged
 - ⇒ temporary firm closures affect labor income
- Larger declines in wealth and consumption for homeowners vs renters
 - ⇒ lower housing prices amplify indirect effects

Key takeaways

1. Extreme weather events are becoming more frequent and costly in Norway

2. Despite insurance, affected households have seen a relative fall in their income, wealth and consumption

3. Indirect impact driven by damages to firms and lower housing prices
